

# Musa and Amina's Big Hajj Adventure

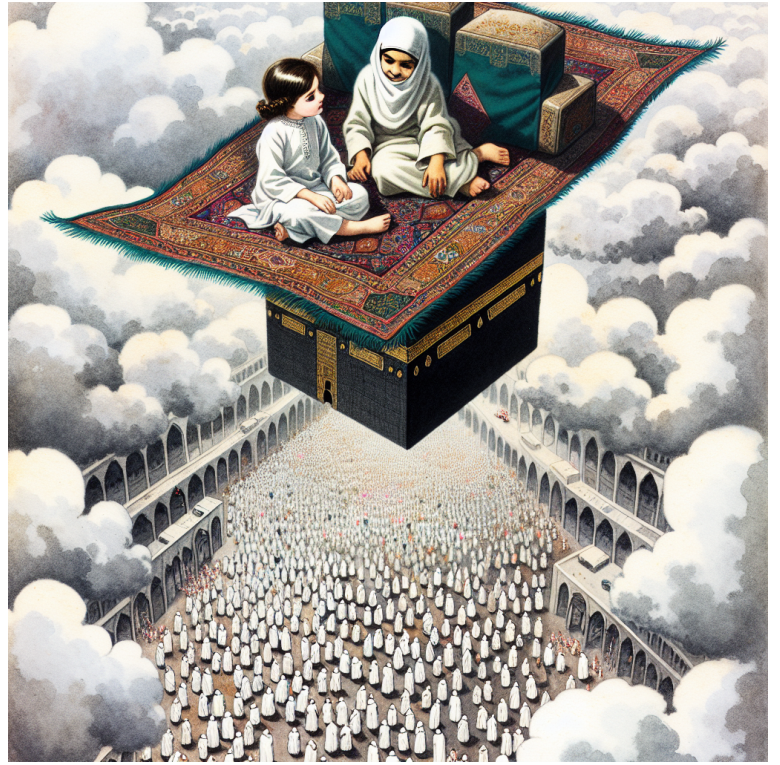
